LABOUR MARKET

Average employment in Warsaw in enterprise sector in January 2016 amounted to 987.3 thousand people and was by 7.6 thousand people, i.e. 0.8% higher than in December 2015, and by 20.9 thousand people, i.e. 2.2% higher compared with January 2015.

At the end of January 2016 the number of **registered unemployed persons** equated to 40893 and was higher by 1169 persons, i.e. 2.9% than at the end of December 2015 and by 9113 persons, i.e. 18.2% lower than during the similar period of the year 2015.

The number of **unemployed women** amounted to 19710 which constituted 48.2% of all unemployed residents (in the previous month 48.4% and in the previous year 48.1%).

The registered unemployment rate equaled 3.5% (3.4% in December 2015, and 4.3% in January 2015).

TRADE

Retail sales in trade and non-trade enterprises in January 2016 (in current prices) was by 32.1% lower than in December 2015 and by 4.0% lower compared with January 2015.

Wholesale in trade enterprises in January 2016 (in current prices) decreased by 18.1% as compared with the previous month and increased by 7.6% as compared with January 2015; in wholesale enterprises it was lower by 18.1% and higher 5.7% respectively.

INDUSTRY AND CONSTRUCTION

Sold production of industry in January 2016 amounted to (in current prices) 8518.0 mln zł (1918.3 mln EUR¹) and was lower by 4.1% (in constant prices) compared with January 2015.

Sold production of construction in January 2016 stood at (in current prices) 1733.9 mln zł (390.5 mln EUR¹) and compared with December 2015 decreased by 49.0%, and compared with the same period of the previous year it was by 13.7% higher.

WAGES AND SALARIES

Average monthly gross wages and salaries in enterprise sector in January 2016 amounted to 5366.41 zł (1208.5 EUR¹) and were 4.2% lower than in December 2015, and 4.5% higher than in the similar period of 2015.

HOUSING CONSTRUCTION

According to preliminary data, 1656 dwellings were completed in Warsaw in January 2016 (28.5% more than in the same period of 2015).

In January 2016 construction of 1192 dwellings was initiated (58.9% more than during the similar period of 2015).

22 FEBRUARY EUROPEAN DAY OF VICTIMS OF CRIME

Day of the Victims of Crime is celebrated in Poland under the Act of the Polish Parliament of 12 February 2003 to assist victims of crime and to take action to improve their position.

In 2015, according to the National Police Headquarters in Warsaw it recorded 49.0 thousand ascertained crimes in completed preparatory proceedings (as compared with 2014 the number of crimes decreased by 2.6%).

- In Warsaw the structure of crimes was dominated by criminal offences (78.6%).
- The proportion of business crimes was 14.7% and road traffic crimes 4.4%.
- The delinquents detection rate for all crimes ascertained in Warsaw stood at 39.3%.
- The number of ascertained crimes per 1 000 population was 28.

At the end of June 2015 the capital city had 1 739 586 inhabitants. In comparison with the analogous period of 2014 the population increased by 0.6%. The highest increase of the population was registered in Wilanów (by 7.2%) and Białołęka (by 3.9%) and the lowest – in Wola (by 0.4%) and Ursynów (by 0.5%). In Warsaw population density was 3 363 persons per km².

The femininity ratio (number of women per 100 men) was 118; women were 54.1% of the population.

In the first half of 2015 in the capital city there were 9511 live births, which was by 1.3% more than in the analogous period of 2014. Birth rate per 1 000 population was 10.95 which was 0.08 points higher than in 2014.

In the discussed period 9 469 persons (including 32 infants) died in Warsaw. Death rate per 1 000 population stood at 10.90, compared to 10.55 in 2014.

Infant death rate (per 1 000 live births) was 3.36 and was 0.58 points lower than a year earlier. Natural increase was positive and stood at 0.05‰.

In the first half of 2015 in Warsaw 3 028 marriages were contracted, 156 more than in 2014. Marriage rate, which is the number of marriages per 1 000 population, was 3.49‰, by 0.16 points higher than in the analogous period of 2014.

Net migration (internal and international, for permanent residence) in the first half of 2015 was positive and amounted to 4 102 persons, of which plus 268 accounted for international migration.
