LABOUR MARKET

Average employment in Warsaw in enterprise sector in January 2017 amounted to 1029.3 thousand people and was by 21.2 thousand people higher than in December 2016, and by 42.0 thousand people higher compared with January 2016.

At the end of January 2017 the number of **registered unemployed persons** equated to 34280 and was higher by 1068 persons, i.e. 3.2% than at the end of December 2016 and by 6613 persons, i.e. 16.2% lower than during the similar period of the year 2016.

The number of **unemployed women** amounted to 17076 which constituted 49.8% of all unemployed residents (in the previous month 50.1% and in the previous year 48.2%).

The registered unemployment rate equaled 2.8% (2.8% in December 2016 and 3.4% in January 2016).

TRADE

Retail sales in trade and non-trade enterprises in January 2017 (in current prices) was by 28.9% lower than in December 2016 and by 7.9% higher compared with January 2016.

Wholesale in trade enterprises in January 2017 (in current prices) decreased by 14.0% as compared with the previous month and increased by 17.3% as compared with January 2016; in wholesale enterprises it was lower by 14.4% and higher by 13.8% respectively.

INDUSTRY AND CONSTRUCTION

Sold production of industry in January 2017 amounted to (in current prices) 9026.2 mln zł (2084.2 mln EUR¹) and was higher by 7.3% (in constant prices) compared with January 2016.

Sold production of construction in January 2017 stood at (in current prices) 1847.7 mln zł (426.6 mln EUR¹) and was by 61.8% lower than in December 2016 and by 6.6% higher than over the same period of the previous year.

WAGES AND SALARIES

Average monthly gross wages and salaries in enterprise sector in January 2017 amounted to 5528.78 zł (1276.6 EUR¹) and were 4.3% lower than in December 2016, and 3.0% higher than in the similar period of 2016.

HOUSING CONSTRUCTION

According to preliminary data, 2127 dwellings were completed in Warsaw in January 2017 (24.5% more than in the same period of 2016).

22 FEBRUARY EUROPEAN DAY OF VICTIMS OF CRIME

Day of the Victims of Crime is celebrated in Poland under the Act of the Polish Parliament of 12 February 2003 to assist victims of crime and to take action to improve their position.

In 2016, according to the National Police Headquarters in Warsaw it recorded 48.6 thousand ascertained crimes in completed preparatory proceedings (as compared with 2015 the number of crimes decreased by 0.8%).

- In Warsaw the structure of crimes was dominated by criminal offences (75.9%).

- The proportion of business crimes was 16.8% and road traffic crimes 4.4%.

- The delinquents detection rate for all crimes ascertained in Warsaw stood at 43.1%.

- The number of ascertained crimes per 1 000 population was 27.8.

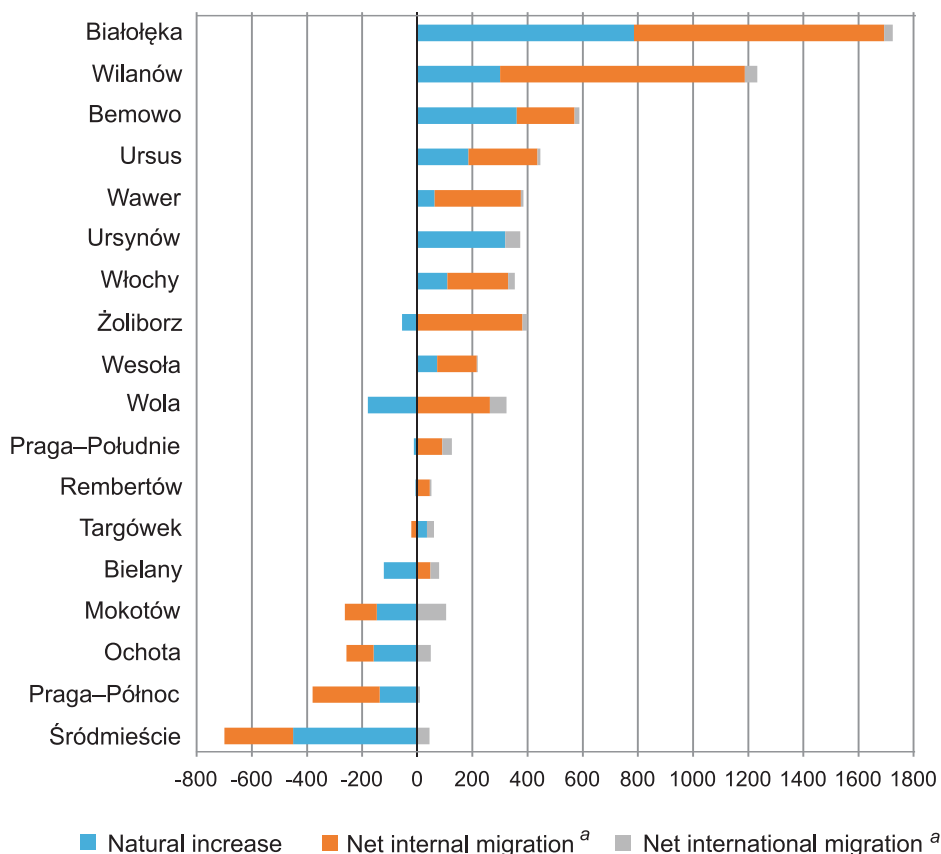

At the end of June 2016 the population of the Capital City of Warsaw amounted to 1,748,900. It was by 4,565 persons more than at the end of 2015. The capital of Mazovia is one of the few voivodship cities with growing population and positive net migration rate. During the first half of 2016, difference between inflow and outflow of population for permanent residence related to internal migration equated to 3,026 persons and related to international migration equated to 577 persons. On account of natural increase, i.e. difference between the number of live births and deaths, Warsaw population grew by 962 persons. It means that every 1,000 population increased by 5 persons, of which 4 persons due to migration and 1 person due to natural increase. The largest relative population growth (by 74 persons) was noted in Wilanów district, while the largest population decline in Praga-Północ and Śródmieście (by 11 persons in each of the districts).
