Increase in the number of employed persons compared to the previous quarter


In Q4 2022, there was an increase in the number of employed persons, and a decrease in the number of economically inactive persons compared to Q3 2022. Unemployed men looked for a job shorter than women, and unemployed urban residents shorter than rural residents.

Economic activity of population aged 15-89 according to LFS

In the fourth quarter of 2022, among the total population of Mazowieckie Voivodship aged 15-89, 60.8% represented employed persons, 1.6% – unemployed, and 37.6% – economically inactive persons. This means that less than half of the population aged 15-89 (39.2%) did not work. In urban and rural areas this structure looked similar. However, significant differences were visible in the structure of men and women. Without employment (economically inactive and unemployed) were 32.4% of men and 45.3% of women.

More than 39% of population aged 15-89 did not work


Chart 1. Structure of population aged 15-89 by sex in Q4 2022



Compared to the third quarter of 2022, the number of employed persons increased by 0.3%, and of unemployed persons did not change. On the other hand, the number of economically inactive persons decreased (by 0.3%). A reduction in the ratio of non-working population over working population was observed. In the fourth quarter of 2022, there were 645 unemployed and economically inactive persons per 1000 employed persons, while in the third quarter of 2022 – 649.



The economic activity rate was 62.4% and increased by 0.2 pp compared to the previous quarter. There was an increase in the level of economic activity among men (by 0.4 pp) and there were no changes among women. This indicator increased in rural areas (by 1.3 pp) and decreased (by 0.5%) in urban areas.

Chart 3. Economic activity of population in Q4 2022




The highest value of the rate in terms of age was recorded for the age group 35–44, which amounted to 92.3%, while the lowest among persons aged 55-89 – 30.2%. For working age population, this rate was 84.7%.

Employed persons

In the fourth quarter of 2022, in Mazowieckie Voivodship, the population of employed persons counted 2618 thousand persons, and the employment rate was estimated at 60.8% (a 0.2 pp increase compared to the previous quarter).

Compared to the third quarter of 2022, the number of employed persons increased 0.3%. There was an increase among men (by 0.1%) and among women (by 0.6%). The number of employed persons increased in rural (by 2.2%), and decreased in urban areas (by 0.6%).

In the fourth quarter of 2022, the highest employment rate was recorded among persons aged 35–44 (91.1%), and the lowest among persons aged 15–24 (28.3%). The highest decrease of the rate was recorded among persons aged 15-24 (by 3.0 pp), and the highest increase among persons aged 45-54 (by 1.5 pp).


For working age population, the employment rate reached 82.4% (a 0.3 pp increase compared to the third quarter of 2022).

Among employed persons according to the level of education, the highest employment rate recorded persons with higher education – 81.6%, and the lowest among persons with lower secondary and less education – 14.9%. The highest increase in the employment rate occurred among persons with post-secondary and vocational secondary education (by 1.4 pp), and the largest decrease among persons with lower secondary and less education (by 3.8 pp).

In the fourth quarter of 2022, there were 2061 thousand persons employed in the public and private sector (i.e. 78.7% of total employees), and their number decreased by 1.2% compared to the third quarter of 2022. There was an increase both among employers and self-employed persons (from 494 thousand to 535 thousand), and a decrease among contributing family workers (from 30 thousand to 22 thousand). The vast majority of employed persons supported the private sector (68.2% of the total). Of these, the majority (54.7%) were men. The situation was different among persons employed in the public sector, where among 656 thousand employed persons predominated women (64.2%). There were 85.5% of employees employed for an indefinite period (a 1.4 pp increase compared to the third quarter of 2022).

Over 68% of total employed persons worked in the private sector

Unemployed persons

In the fourth quarter of 2022, the population of unemployed persons (aged 15-74) in Mazowieckie Voivodship amounted to 70 thousand persons and did not change compared to the third quarter of 2022.

Compared to the previous quarter, the number of unemployed women decreased (by 21.6%), and the number of men increased (by 21.2%). There was an increase among rural residents (by 6.7%), and an increase among urban residents (by 5.0%).

The number of unemployed women decreased by over 22%, and the number of men increased by over 21% The total unemployment rate in the Voivodship amounted to 2.6% and did not change compared to the third quarter of 2022. In urban areas it was 2.2% (by 1.1 pp lower than in rural areas). For working age population the unemployment rate was 2.7%.


Compared to the third quarter of 2022, the unemployment rate decreased among women (by 0.6 pp), and increased among men (by 0.5 pp). There was an increase in rural (by 0.1 pp), and a decrease in urban areas (by 0.1 pp).

An average time of job seeking by unemployed persons amounted to 7.4 months. Men looked for a job for 7.2 months on average (by 0.6 months shorter than women), and urban residents for 6.8 months (by 1.4 months shorter than rural residents).

The population of long-term unemployed persons (13 months and more) accounted for 15.7% of the total unemployed (decrease by 5.4 pp compared to the third quarter of 2022).

Chart 6. Structure of the unemployed by duration of job seeking in Q4 2022




Economically inactive persons

In the fourth quarter of 2022, in Mazowieckie Voivodship, 1619 thousand persons remained economically inactive, which accounted for 37.6% of total population aged 15-89 (in rural areas – 37.4% and in urban areas – 37.7%). Still, in this population women were the majority – 61.7%. Among economically inactive persons, as in previous periods, persons with lower secondary and less education predominated – 27.0%. Working age population made up 28.7% of total economically inactive persons.

Among the economically inactive women predominate – almost 62%

Compared to the third quarter of 2022, the population of economically inactive persons decreased by 0.3% (among men it decreased by 1.1%, and among women increased by 0.1%). Taking into account the place of residence, there was a decrease in the number of economically inactive persons among rural residents (by 3.2%), and an increase in the number of urban residents (by 1.4%).

Out of total economically inactive persons (aged 15-74), 52.0% accounted for persons who did not seek work because of being retired. Other reasons for economic inactivity were: education and training – 25.2%, illness or disability – 9.4%, family and household responsibilities – 7.8%.
