

## Foreigners on the Masovian labour market in 2022 <sup>1</sup>



The year 2022 in Mazowieckie Voivodship was second in a row in which the number of work permits for foreigners decreased annually and amounted to almost 67 thousand. Work permits were most often issued to Ukrainian citizens (almost 13 thousand), but this number decreased by over 75% annually.

In 2022, 66.8 thousand work permits for foreigners were issued in Mazowieckie Voivodship, i.e. by 26.6% less than a year before. Mazowieckie was the first in terms of the number of permits issued among voivodships (before Wielkopolskie – 53.2 thousand, Śląskie – 37.2 thousand and Pomorskie – 32.1 thousand).


The largest number – 13.4 thousand, i.e. 20.1% of work permits for foreigners were granted to citizens of Ukraine (in 2021 – 54.2 thousand, i.e. 59.5%). Compared to 2021, this number decreased by as much as 75.2%, and the share by 39.4 pp. Next, work permits were issued to citizens of Turkey (8.5 thousand compared to 3.0 thousand in 2021; an increase of 182.8%), India (8.1 thousand compared to 3.8 thousand; increase by 115.4%) and Belarus (4.3 thousand compared by 8.4 thousand; decrease by 48.3%).

The vast majority of issued work permits concerned men. Their share in the total number of all permits issued in Mazowieckie Voivodship in 2022 amounted to 83.3% (75.3% in 2021). The predominance of men in terms of permits occurred in all voivodships, In Poland, this share was on average 82.8% (from 79.1% in Pomorskie to 90.5% in Świętokrzyskie). The number of permits issued in Mazowieckie Voivodship compared to 2021 was lower for women by 50.5% and for men by 18.7%.

The number of work permits issued to citizens of Ukraine decreased by more than 3/4 in annual terms


Over 83% of work permits were issued to men

The largest group of foreigners who received work permits were persons aged 25–34 (40.0%) and 35–44 (29.0%). This percentage was similar among both sexes (respectively: men – 40.4% and 29.4%; women – 37.9% and 26.9%).

Work permits for foreigners in Mazowieckie Voivodship, as in 2021, are issued for longer periods of time. In 2022, the majority (49.1% compared to 43.0% in 2021) of work permits were issued for a period of more than 24 months, followed by for the period from 6 to 12 months (40.7% compared to 43.3%). On the other hand, the permits with the shortest validity period, i.e. up to 6 months, constituted only 0.2% of their total number.

Most (58.1%) work permits concerned employment contracts, followed by order-agreements (37.9%).

Chart 4. Structure of work permits for foreigners by period of their validity in 2022




In 2022, the most permits were issued to employers from the construction section (19.4 thousand), which accounted for 29.1% of total permits (compared to 29.2% in 2021), followed by employers from the transportation and storage section (19.9% compared to 23.0%), as well as administrative and support service activities (14.9% compared to 16.4%).

Almost 90% of work permits were issued for a period of validity from 6 months to 1 year and more than 2 years

Most (more than 29%) work permits were issued in construction

In 2022, foreigners who obtained a work permit in Mazowieckie Voivodshp, as in 2021, most often worked as industrial workers and craftsmen – 37.6%, workers performing elementary occupations – 20.5%, as well as plant and machine operators and assemblers – 16.2%.

Most (almost 38%) of foreigners worked as industrial workers and craftsmen
