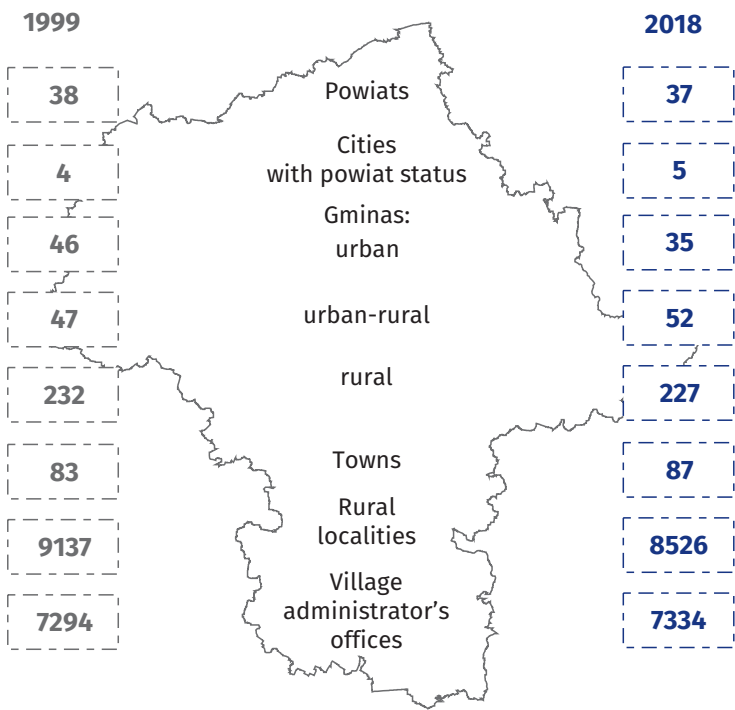


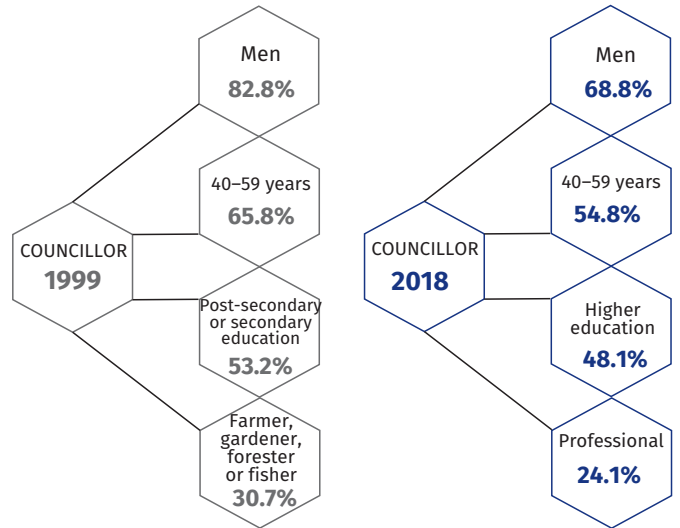

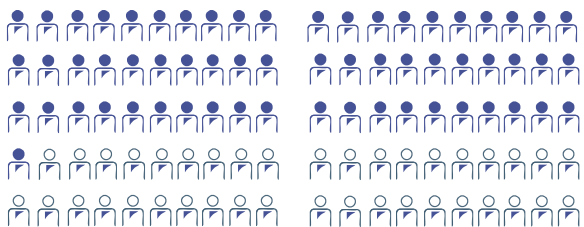

The Warsaw capital city district councils

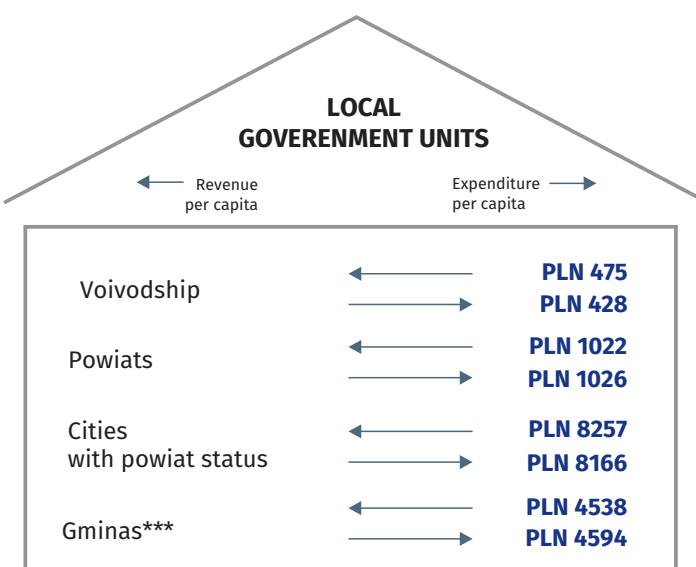

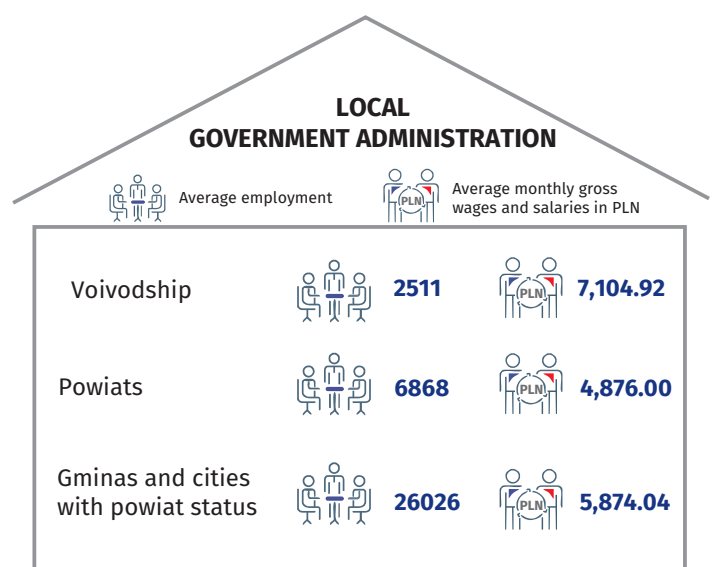


In 2018, 289 men and 43 women served as commune mayors, mayors and city mayors, and 4289 men and 2983 women served as village administrators
